The Trinity River Act of 1955 specifically mandated that fish and wildlife be protected. Today, the Coho Salmon is listed as an endangered species, and the Steelhead are a candidate for listing. I urge you to restore the Trinity River and its entire ecosystem by implementing a flow management system of at least 70%.

Clearly, restoration of the Trinity River is a top priority. The 1955 Trinity River law specifically states that fish and wildlife must be protected. The Trinity River Basin Fish and Wildlife Management Act of 1984, and the Central Valley Project Improvement Act both call for restoration of the Trinity River ecosystem. However, since the dams were completed by 1963, water diversions on the Trinity River have led to a 90% decline in fish populations.

When the Trinity River is restored, the commercial and sport fishing, rafting, and tourism economies of the Northern California and Southern Oregon region will rebound. I urge you to increase the flow of the Trinity River to at least 70% in order to ensure protection of the Coho Salmon and increase the recreational value of the Trinity River. 

I understand there are to be hearings held to determine whether flows down the Trinity River will be increased from 30% (or less) to a standard flow of about 70%.

When Senator Clair Engle plumped for the Trinity Dam project in the late 1950's, he stated that not one bucket of water would go into the Sacramento if it was needed in the Trinity

Didn't take an expert waterologist to see destruction done to the river early on. Jungle-like growth, though not quite as bad as lower Putah Creek below Berryessa Reservoir. On the Trinity too is the unseen demolition: drastic reduction of salmon, steelhead & their dependent species; crawfish, turtles, mussels, raccoons, eais & peripheral reliants. There had to be dramatic declines in those unglamorous animal populations, but as minor species, likely not worthy of study.

Many of our members have fished and continue to fish the Trinity River. It is the recommendation of the Stanislaus Fly Fishermen that 70% of the natural river flows be retained in the river as oppose to 48% as per the preferred alternative.

We recognize that the salmon and steelhead runs have been devastated by the heavy diversions from the river for crop irrigation in the Central Valley. This devastation has come about not only because of the diminution of water in river but because of the effect of the lower flow regimes on riverine and riparian habitat.

Restoration of these fisheries is of critical importance, not just to sport fishermen, but to the commercial salmon industry, tribal members, and residents of Trinity, Humboldt, and Del Norte counties whose economies have been significantly and adversely affected by the devastation of the salmon and steelhead runs.

The preferred recommendation of 48% will not be effective to restore these fisheries without continuing congressional appropriations for habitat restoration projects. It is much less expensive, and considerably less chancy, to let the river restore itself by retaining 70% of the flow in the river. As we all know, congress is fickle-it giveth and it taketh away.

It seems simply unconscionable to rob Peter (commercial fishermen, Indians, and residents of the northern counties) to pay Paul (Central Valley water users).
