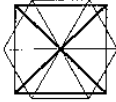

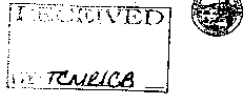

I am writing you today to express my concern over the Draft Trinity River Restoration Environmental Impact Statement. In order to restore the Trinity River and its entire ecosystem, **I urge you to adopt a management system that returns at least 70% of the flow for the Trinity River.** Science has demonstrated that a river needs at least 70% of its flow to maintain a healthy fishery. } 168-1

The Trinity River Act of 1955 states that it is essential that fish and wildlife not face extinction. Unfortunately, extinction is exactly what is happening for fish populations of the Trinity River, where coho salmon are listed as an endangered species and steelhead are a candidate for listing. Overall, fish populations have declined by 90% since the Trinity River Act was enacted into law in 1955. Further misguided management of the Trinity River ecosystem should be avoided. Restoration of the Trinity River is mandated through the Trinity River Basin Fish and Wildlife Management Act of 1984. In addition, as a result of excessive water diversion, two American Indian tribes, the Hoopa Valley and Yurok, have been denied water rights to the Trinity River.
