Dear Mr. Polos,

I am writing to you today to ask you to help restore the Trinity River and its fisheries. You can do this by establishing a flow regime that allows the Trinity River to keep at least 70 percent of its flow. } 1388-1

Since the Trinity Dam was completed in 1963, up to 90 per cent of the Trinity River's water has been diverted for agriculture. As a result of the decreased flows, fish populations have declined by nearly 90 per cent. It is time to return the water to the river so we can restore and maintain a healthy ecosystem and fishery before the point of total collapse occurs.

The legislation which authorized building Trinity Dam directed the Interior Secretary to ensure that fish and wildlife were protected (Trinity River Act of 1955). That has not happened to date and needs to be changed. The fish need the freshwater flows to survive there is no other way around it. The federal government also has an obligation to fulfill its legally mandated trust responsibilities to the Hoopa and Yurok Tribes by maintaining the fisheries for them. This obligation has also gone unfulfilled and must be corrected immediately. Finally there are substantial economic benefits to restoring the Trinity, which include expanded commercial and sports fishing, rafting and tourism. } 1388-2

Please do the right thing and restore at least 70 percent of the Trinity's flow back to the river.

Dear Mr. Polos:

My name is Tim McKay, I am the executive director of the Northcoast Environmental Center, founded in 1971, to help illuminate the relationships of humankind to the biosphere. In that regard, I am offering these comments on the draft Trinity River Mainstem Fishery Restoration EIS/EIR.

It is our understanding, based upon the original Trinity River Division legislation, and much subsequent legislation, that no more than 30 percent of the river's water was to be diverted to the Central Valley Project. Unfortunately, such promises are only as good as the politicians who make them, and as you know as much as 90 percent of the river's flow has been diverted historically, while more recently that amount has fallen to 75 percent of the mainstem's flow. Nonetheless the salmon fisheries of the mainstem Trinity are devastated.

We also understand that the water in question is contracted to the San Joaquin Valley's Westlands Water District where it waters large corporate farms in violation of a law that was to assure the water to small family farms. And, as if all of the forgoing weren't enough mendacity to choke a pig at a pork barrel trough, the water in question also leaches toxic selenium out of the harsh San Joaquin soils creating a hazard to humans and wildlife.

Now, given the current CALFED effort is another example of assurances that people will be asked to believe, and be again willing to accept that their government does not lie to them—I can only remember the story of the boy who cried wolf. The government has lost its credibility regarding the Trinity River, and the corporate beneficiaries of its waters are not known for their good faith efforts on behalf of the environment or its salmon.

Also, I am told that the Environmental Impact Statement/Report inaccurately spreads adverse power cost impacts pro-rata on a county by county basis. In fact, these costs are based upon individual contracts, and this data should be revised.

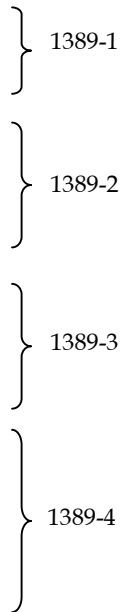
In addition, I am told that Trinity County never has been provided with the preferential power rates dictated by law in the Trinity River Division Act of 1955. And now its residents are expected to pay about \$11 million – according to the Trinity PUD - to pay for restoration programs, and to absorb increased power costs.

Promised funding for the Trinity restoration program is not assured and often has not been forthcoming, and sadly when restoration monies do trickle down agencies and restorationists, who ostensibly have the environment’s interest at heart, they squabble like dogs over bones for the funds, funds much of which are absorbed as “overhead.”

So, given that Trinity river water was taken under false pretext and promise, and that those who would restore the river with our tax dollars can not find consensus on doing so, and as well that the historical record of the appropriators (the Congress) is spotty at best, it leads us to conclude that the only reasonable alternative for the Trinity River is to decommission the dam and diversion, and let the Trinity flows return to their natural regime.

As a student of history, I do not see how I could reach any other



Dear Mr. Polos,

Since Trinity Dam was completed in 1963, up to 90 percent of the Trinity River's water has been diverted for agriculture, principally to the western San Joaquin Valley. As a result of decreased flows, fish populations have declined by nearly 90 percent. As you know, the Trinity River Mainstem Fisheries Restoration Environmental Impact Statement and Report (EIS/R) has been released and now is open for Public Comment. The Preferred Alternative still allows over half the water to be diverted from the basin. Science has determined that a river needs at least 70 percent of its flow to maintain a healthy fishery. I am writing in support of the implementation of a flow regime that allows the Trinity to keep at least 70 percent of its water, for the following reasons:

1. The Trinity River Act of 1955, authorizing the dams, specifically mandated that the fish and wildlife of the basin not be harmed. The Interior Secretary was directed to ensure that fish and wildlife in the basin were protected. However, since the dams were completed in 1963, water diversions led to a nearly 90 percent decline in the fisheries by the early 1990's. The coho salmon now is listed under the Endangered Species Act, and steelhead are a candidate for listing.

2. The federal government's trust obligations to two Native American tribes have gone unfulfilled for more than 36 years because of excessive water diversions from the Trinity River. The time has come for the federal government to begin fulfilling its legally mandated responsibilities to the Hoopa Valley and Yurok Tribes.

3. Two decades of study and scientific evidence have given us the needed information to make a good decision for the Trinity. While the science and study that produced the Flow Evaluation Report are sound, the recommendations were limited by an assumption about the amount of water that could be available for the river. However, more water can be made available since the legislation creating the Trinity River Division, and later legislation, clearly gives Trinity fish and wildlife priority over the diversion of any water to the CVP.

4. When the Trinity is restored, the commercial and sport fishing, rafting, and tourism economies of Northern California and Southern Oregon will rebound.

5. The Trinity River and its restoration program are completely independent of the CALFED process. Restoration of the Trinity River is mandated in the

1955 legislation authorizing construction of the Trinity River Division, the Trinity River Basin Fish and Wildlife Management Act of 1984, and the Central Valley Project Improvement Act (CVPIA). The CVPIA reaffirms the Trinity's unique position within the Central Valley Project (CVP) and clearly sets forth that restoration of the Trinity is to be considered independently from other California water issues.

6. The federal government's promise to maintain a healthy fishery in the Trinity River has been disregarded for the last 36 years, and past legislation mandated a flow decision by the end of 1996. If these legislated promises are not finally fulfilled, it will undercut the credibility of promises subsequently developed through CALFED. A restored Trinity River will allow Californians to have faith that the ongoing CALFED negotiations will produce meaningful improvement in our state's water policies.



As you know since 1963 up to 90% of the water normally flowing down the Trinity River has been diverted into the Sacramento River system for use by agribusiness in the Sacramento and San Joaquin Valleys. This water has been pumped over a minor mountain range in the opposite direction from which the Trinity flows and has severely damaged the populations of several fisheries declared threatened or endangered under the Endangered Species Act. The water and these fisheries are the property of the citizens of the state of California.

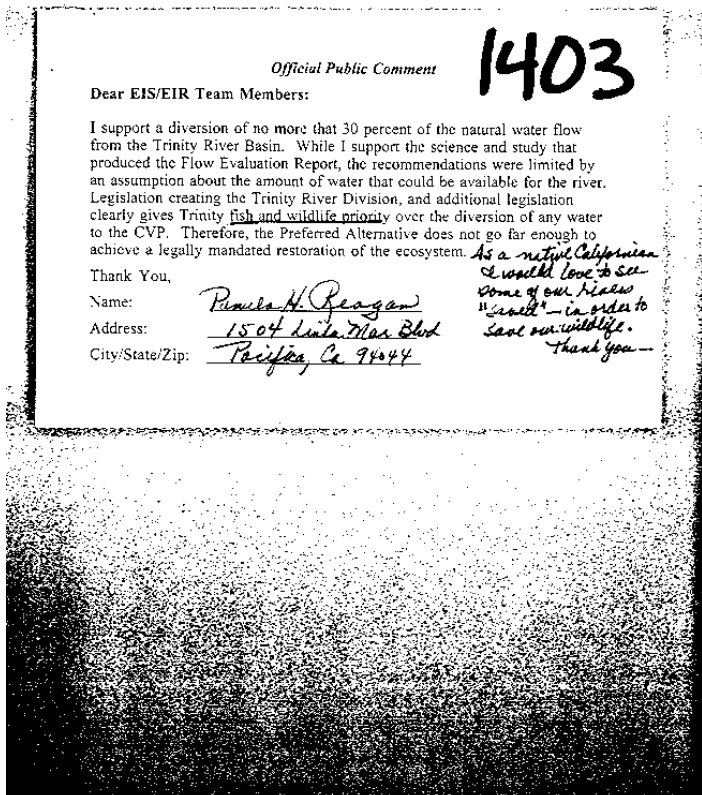

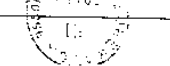
