There is also no question that Trinity County in general will benefit from the economics of having a healthier river.


Since decisions were made many years ago to build the dam, create some reservoirs, control flooding, hydro and export water. The results had broad appeal to many.



In 1992, an unprecedented coalition of fisheries conservation organizations, environmental groups, business organizations and Indian Tribes successfully lobbied the U.S. Congress to pass the Central Valley Project Improvement Act. Under this legislation, the Secretary of Interior was mandated to determine the

flows required to achieve the restoration of the Trinity River. Unfortunately, the Trinity River Flow Evaluation report conducted by the federal government calls for the diversion of 52 percent of Trinity flows to the Central Valley.

It is time for the federal government to fulfill its broken promises to the citizens, businesses and tribes of Trinity County. The federal government has to face up to its responsibility under the law to restore the river's water and fish.

Friends of the Trinity River, a coalition of conservation, fisheries and business organizations, is pushing for diversions of no more than 30 percent of the flow of the Trinity. You should join them in this effort.

In a few months, after 20 years of study, the U.S. Secretary of the Interior, Bruce Babbitt, will make a decision on the amount of water to reallocate permanently to the river. He will base his decision largely on the Trinity River EIS/R and your comments.

Your comments will help the Trinity River to become a model for restoring a river below a federally-financed dam. Currently, the Trinity is the only river in the United States with such an opportunity. Let's not blow this historic opportunity through apathy and indifference.
