



Dear Mr. Polos.

GOLD COUNTRY PADLLERS is California's largest whitewater paddling club, with over 500 members. Our members have kayaked throughout the Trinity basin, and it is one of our favorite river systems. But as boaters we are keenly aware that the Trinity, beautiful as it is, is not what it could be.

Since the Trinity's dams were completed in 1963, up to 90 percent of the river's water has been directed for agriculture, principally to marginal lands in the western San Joaquin Valley. Decreased flows have limited whitewater recreation potential, and firm populations have fallen nearly 90 percent.

The Trinity EIR/S's Preferred Alternative still allows over helf the water to be diverted from the casin. Science has determined that a river needs at least 70 percent of its first to maintain a healthy fishery. Similarly, the river basin's recreational economy deserves to receive more than merely half of the income potential represented by its water.

We are writing in support of the implementation of a flow regime that allows the Trinity to keep at least 70 percent of its water, for these and the following reasons:

- 1. When the Trinity is restored, the commercial and sport fishing, whitewater recreation, and courism economies of Northern California and Southern Oregon will rebound. Fisheries science is complex, but the relationship between water in the river and whitewater recreation potential is not. More water means more boating, and than means more boaters spending more dollars in the Trinity basin's local economy. The Trinity River is a unique resource from a whitewater boating perspective. It offers over 75 miles of class II through class V whitewater, including high quality stretches of river suitable for novices, intermediates, and experts alike. The number of whitewater canoeists, rafters, and kayakers has increased exponentially in the last few years, and consequently, the Trinity's potential has never been greater to attract the business of whitewater enthysists.
- 2. The Trinity River Act of 1955, in authorizing the dams, specifically mendated that the fish and wildlife of the basin not be harmed. But since the dams were completed in 1962, water diversions have caused a nearly 90 percent decline in the fisheries. The coho salmon now is listed under the Endangered Species Act, and steelhead are a candidate for listing.
- 3. The federal government's trust obligations to two Native American tribes have gone unfulfilled for more than 36 years because of excessive water diversions. The time has come to meet our obligations to the Hoopa and the Yurok.
- 4. Two decades of scientific study have now given us the knowledge to make good decisions regarding the Trinity. While the science that produced the Flow



Evaluation Report is sound, its' recommendations were limited by narrow assumptions about the amount of water available for the river. More water can be made available since the legislation creating the Trinity River Division, and later legislation, gives Trinity fish and wildlife clear priority over the diversion of any water to the CVP.

5. The Trinity River and its restoration program are completely independent of the CALPEO process. Restoration of the Trinity River is mandated in the 1935 legislation authorizing construction of the Trinity River Davision, in the Trinity River Basin Fish and Wildlife Management Act of 1984, and in the Central Valley Project Improvement Act (CVPIA). The CVPIA reaffirms the Trinity's unique position in the CVP, and clearly sets forth that restoration of the Trinity is to be considered independently from other California water issues.

6. The federal government's promise to maintain a healthy fishery in the Trinity River has been ignored for 36 years. Past legislation mandated a flow decision by the end of 1996. If these legislated promises are not finally fulfilled, it will underout the credibility of promises subsequently to be developed through CALFED. A restored Trinity River will give Californians faith that the ongoing CALFED negotiations will produce meaningful improvement in our state's water policies.
