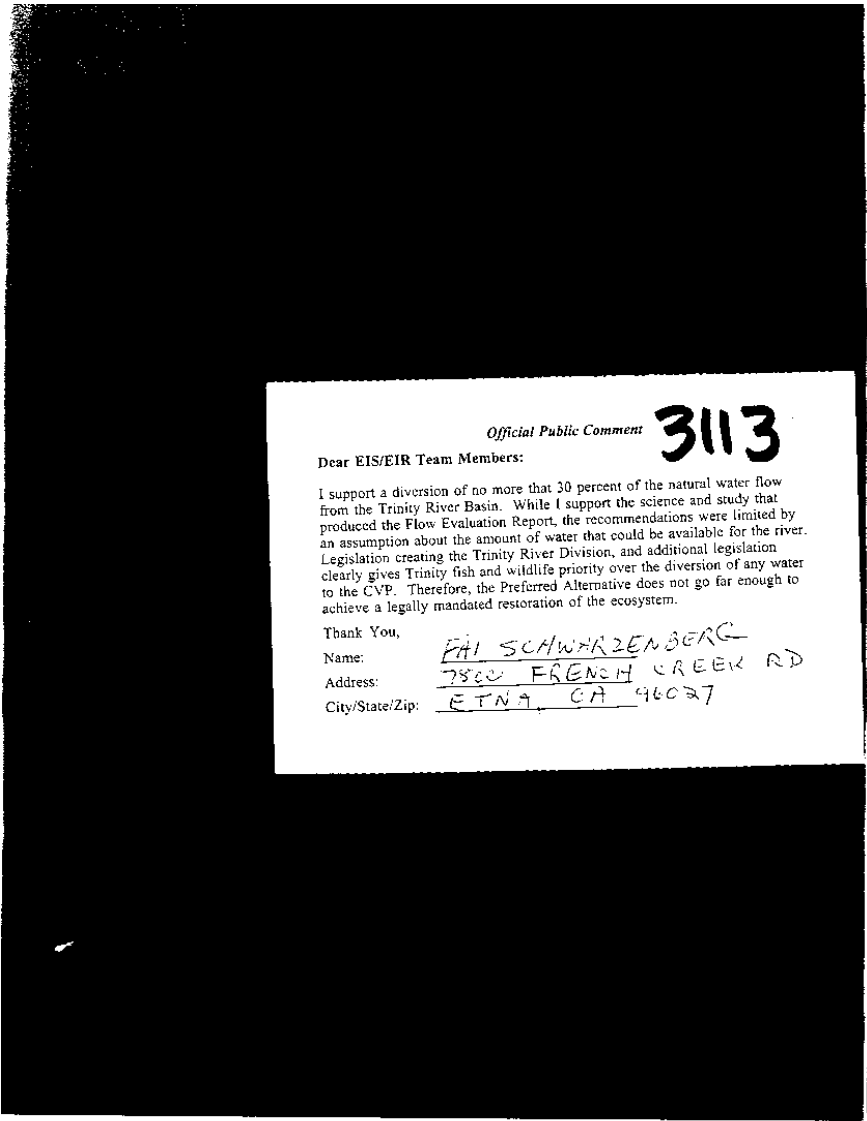


Dear Mr Polos,


