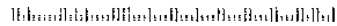


4. When the Trinity is restored, the **commercial and sport fishing, rafting, and tourism** economies of the Northern California and Southern Oregon **will rebound**.
