- The Trinity River Act of 1955 authorized the Trinity River Division of the Central Valley project. In order to protect the Trinity River Basin area of origin, Congress directed the Secretary of Interior to ensure the preservation and propagation of fish and wildlife in the basin as a condition of diversion of water. However, since the Trinity and Lewiston dams were completed in 1963, water diversions led to a nearly 90 percent decline in the fisheries by the early 1990s. The coho salmon now is listed under the Endangered Species Act, and steelhead are a candidate for listing.
- The federal government's trust obligations to two Native American Tribes have gone
 unfulfilled for more than 36 years because of excessive water diversions from the
 Trinity River. The time has come for the federal government to fully fulfill its legally
 mandated responsibilities to the Hoopa Valley and Yurok Tribes.
