Dear Secretary Babbitt:

As members of the California State Legislature, we ask for your strong support and action to provide for the restoration of the Trinity River.

Protecting and restoring our western rivers is a fundamental responsibility of government at all levels. We in California wish to see strong federal, state, and local agency action to protect our waterways, improve natural habitat, restore salmon runs and save these mighty rivers for future generations of Americans.

- The Trinity River Act of 1955 authorized the Trinity River Division of the Central Valley project. In order to protect the Trinity River Basin area of origin, Congress directed the Secretary of Interior to ensure the preservation and propagation of fish and wildlife in the basin as a condition of diversion of water. However, since the Trinity and Lewiston dams were completed in 1963, water diversions led to a nearly 90 percent decline in the fisheries by the early 1990s. The coho salmon now is listed under the Endangered Species Act, and steelhead are a candidate for listing.
- The federal government's trust obligations to two Native American Tribes have gone unfulfilled for more than 36 years because of excessive water diversions from the Trinity River. The time has come for the federal government to fully fulfill its legally mandated responsibilities to the Hoopa Valley and Yurok Tribes. } 3959-1
- Two decades of study and scientific evidence have given us the needed information to make the right decision for the Trinity. We urge you to take the necessary action to restore the flow regime outlined in the Trinity River Flow Evaluation Final. } 3959-2




