Subject: CEQA Air Quality Guidelines in Colusa County

I contacted the CCAPCD and spoke with Mr. T.J. Gomez about any applicable CEQA guidelines that we should use to conduct air quality impact analysis for projects in Colusa County.

Mr. Gomez indicated that the CCAPCD has no CEQA-related air quality guidelines. The only regulations they have applicable to new projects would be their New Source Review Rules, applicable to stationary sources of air pollution. Mr. Gomez suggested that we may wish to use Tehama County's CEQA guidelines. They list significance criteria of 25 lb/day for NOx and ROG, and 80 lb/day for PM10. Mr. Gomez also indicated that use of the emissions factors from the 2012 analysis would be fine with them, and existing calculations from the earlier version of the study would not require updating to more recent models and emissions factors. They do not have any off-site mitigation fees for construction of area or mobile sources (only stationary sources require mitigation under their NSR rules). They have no program to collect, manage, or disburse construction mitigation fees.
